**One Sentence Statement of Purpose for the Project.**

Increase UNI's capacity to care for Veterans' Administration and Utah's growing mental health population.

**Detailed Description the Project.**

University Neuropsychiatric Institute (UNI) is a full service, 90 bed psychiatric hospital servicing patients with mental illness and substance abuse. The Institute is supported by the University of Utah Department of Psychiatry and University Hospital.

The number of mentally ill and substance abuse patients in Utah is on the rise and there is not enough bed space to accommodate the growing needs of our community. UNI seeks federal funding to add 68 private beds to meet the demands of this ever increasing population.

By increasing UNI's capacity to care for Utah's growing mental health population, services will also expand to meet the needs of the Veteran's Administration as it prepares to treat an increasing mental health and substance abuse patient

population. This highly collaborative project, which will dedicate beds specifically to the Veterans Administration, will provide mental health support that returning veterans and their families deserve. It makes sense for both UNI and the VA to partner in an expansion project where University Health Care staff will work collaboratively with VA clinical staff in an expanded facility with shared bed space.

**State Exactly How the FY10 Funds would be Allocated.**

Funds will be allocated to University Neuropsychiatric Institute and would be used solely for the purpose of adding 60 new patient beds.

**Justification for the Use of Taxpayer Funds for the Project.**

**Mental health, especially among returning veterans, has stretched the limited capacity of facilities that provide necessary care. Federal funding, in conjunction with private funds, will provide access to care that doesn't currently exist.**

The current LSTF was based upon 1990 workload projections and personnel levels. Since then, the interest in biological detection and domestic bio-terrorism has increased by orders of magnitude. Dugway Proving Ground is now the DoD's sole agent for conducting EPA(OGA) support, in the expanding bio-defense mission and in Sustainable Design and Development(SDD). Unfortunately, the LSTF working areas and laboratories were designed and constructed to support only twenty-two personnel, and are now critically undersized to sustain the current and projected workloads. The laboratory and analysis space is insufficient to meet the current and projected workloads. The growing demand has forced the installation to quadruple the projected workforce for which the Facility was designed.

This project is required to ensure the longevity of Dugway Proving Ground as the supply of fresh water in the area slowly diminishes. The current aquifer is the installation's primary "fresh" water source, but is highly contaminated. This project will reduce the arsenic in the drinking water below the Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) as well as reduce other pollutants in the drinking water supply on the installation, bringing it into compliance with the new EPA regulations for drinking water.
