

FISCAL YEAR 2010 DEFENSE AUTHORIZATION BILL

Amendments Co-sponsored by Senator Bob Bennett

Senator Bob Bennett (R-Utah) co-sponsored the following amendments to the Fiscal Year 2010 Defense Authorization Bill:

1. A Thune amendment (#1618) allowing individuals with conceal carry privileges to carry into other states also permitting that same right. *Failed on a 58-31 vote.*
2. A Bennett-Schumer amendment (#1635), the [Military and Overseas Voting Empowering Act](#). *Agreed to unanimously.*
3. A Brownback amendment (#1597) expressing the sense of the Senate that the Secretary of State should re-designate North Korea as a state sponsor of terrorism. *Failed on voice vote.*
4. An Alexander-Bennett amendment (#1507) on to include the [Auto Stock for Taxpayers](#) legislation. *Did not receive a vote.*
5. A Hatch amendment (#1739) to allow an age waiver for qualified military retirees to apply for federal law enforcement employment. *Agreed to unanimously.*
6. A Hatch amendment (#1740) adding report language directing the Department of Defense to develop and submit to Congress a plan regarding the solid rocket motor industrial base. *Agreed to unanimously.*
7. A Kyl Amendment (#1628) expressing the sense of the Senate on imposing sanctions with respect to the Islamic Republic of Iran. *Agreed to unanimously.*
8. A Kyl Amendment (#1760) to pursue United States objectives in bilateral arms control with the Russian Federation. *Agreed to unanimously.*
9. Sessions amendment (#1657) to prohibit the reading of Miranda rights to an enemy combatant or informing them of any rights they may or may not have under the Constitution. *Agreed to unanimously.*

10. A Lieberman amendment (#1744) expressing the sense of the Senate on the development and deployment of a European missile defense system. *Agreed to unanimously.*
11. A Voinovich amendment (#1534) to authorize the National Guard State Partnership Program. *Did not receive a vote.*
12. An Inhofe amendment (#1559) to restrict use of funds for the closure of Guantanamo Bay and the transfer of detainees to U.S. soil or territories. *Did not receive a vote.*
13. A Gregg amendment (#1484) prohibiting the use of federal funds for signage promoting stimulus funds at project sites. *Did not receive a vote.*
14. A Johanns amendment (#1571) supporting the implementation of the U.S.-Colombia Free Trade Agreement. *Did not receive a vote.*
15. A Conrad amendment (#1682) expressing the sense of the Senate regarding the valuable role of the Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles (ICBM) force. *Did not receive a vote.*
